We are approximately four blocks west of the Old Orchard shopping mall and seven blocks west of the intersection of Golf Rd. and Skokie Blvd. We are approximately three blocks east of the intersection of Harms Rd. and Golf Rd.

We have parking on-site.

From 94 East:

- Take the Old Orchard Exit.
- Turn left onto Old Orchard Rd.
- Turn right on Lawler, the second stoplight.
- Continue to the next stoplight and turn right on Golf Rd.
- Continue 2 blocks and North Shore Veterinary Clinic is on your left.

From 94 West

- Take the Old Orchard Exit.
- Turn right onto Old Orchard Rd.
- Turn right on Lawler, the first stoplight.
- Continue to the next stoplight and turn right on Golf. Rd.
- Continue 2 blocks and North Shore Veterinary Clinic is on your left.

What forms of payment are accepted?
